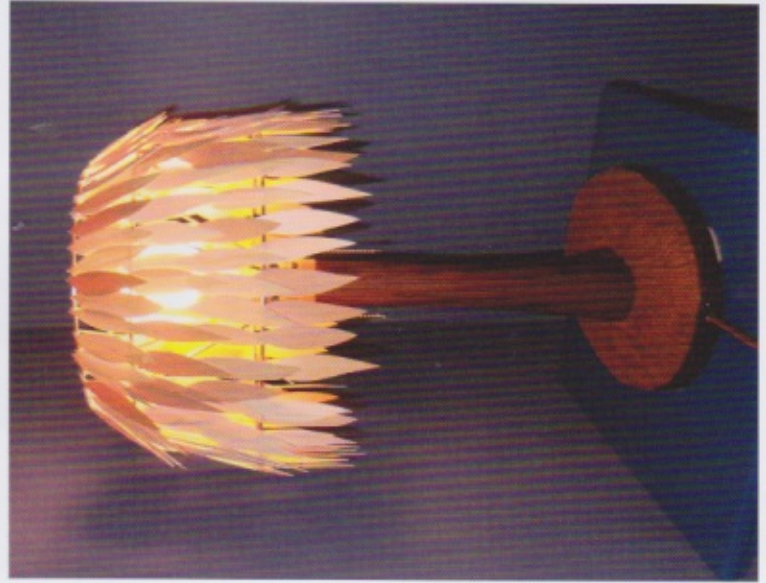

## what is it?

The Woodworker's Guild is a group of woodworking artisans who have a variety of skills who use the Guild's workshop and tools (lathes, routers, planer, table saw, joiner) for projects they are working on. The shop equipment is adequate for casual use but is not designed for heavy-duty needs of professionals. Our member's skills include woodturning, cabinetry, carving, toy making, furniture building to refinishing. The Guild and its members also participate in several annual events where member's proceeds are made available for sale to the public with sale proceeds shared between the Lexington Arts & Crafts Society and the woodworker.

All new members are required to demonstrate safe and proficient use of the equipment before receiving unrestricted use of the shop.
